The Present Orientation letter will help you to explore the factors and situations that will definitely benefit you and your child in the successful journey of this important transition phase.

Parent School Partnership:

Parents play a vital role in their children's physical, emotional, and mental development, especially in the teen years. Hence supporting parents to recognize and nurture their adolescent children's strengths has become crucial so that their children mature from young adolescents into early adulthood.

The importance of parent-school partnership cannot be underestimated. Children benefit much when parents and teachers work together as partners in education. Since parents are the custodians of all the vital information about the students, it becomes much easier when frequent dialogues are established between the parent and teacher.

You are requested to connect with the school/ teachers regularly and share updates about your child. Inform the teacher about what your child is learning and any areas that your child needs additional support, also talk about your child's well-being. Inform the teacher if the child has any special educational needs or disabilities. Ask teachers to share with you any educational videos, online resources that you can share with your child.

We as co-partners in educating your child request you to:

- Create a safe and engaging positive learning environment at home.
- Create a flexible but consistent daily routine. . Get children to decide their daily routine in which there is dedicated time when they would be studying.
- Spend time with your child.
- Be an empathetic listener; while you are listening them, give them your full attention.
- Tell them the behavior you want to see. Use positive language, it works!
- Take care of eating habits of your ward. They must eat healthily
- Be aware and vigilant when they go online. Also, make them aware of privacy issues, cyber bullying, etc
- Use positive disciplining. When children misbehave, try to find out reasons for the behaviour and discuss it with the child, try and understand what is bothering them.

- **Routines Are Important**
 - Set an appropriate sleeping and wake up time so that your child adjusts well with the new timings and is energetic and active during the school hours.
 - Inculcation of planned time management skills and healthy food habits among the children is highly essential at a tender age.
 - Parents need to ensure that they provide adequate and healthy Tiffin so that they enjoy a healthy meal in school.

- Make sure you provide healthy and easily digestible food so that the child doesn't feel over loaded and uneasy during the school hours.
- Teachers would ensure that the child finishes his Tiffin. Further, any issues regarding your child's eating habit could be informed to the class teacher.

Talk to your child about the school

- To help build trust and self-confidence, encourage your child to discuss his feelings about the school.
- Discussions would make the child more expressive and open and help him/her to gain confidence so that he can discuss and talk about all major concerns which he might otherwise be hesitant to.
- Create the feelings of positivity and good will in the child towards the school.

There is value of discipline in all walks of life. Whether at school or at home, in the office or in the factory, in the playground or in the battlefield, discipline is a necessity.

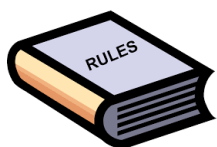
- **Discipline gives us an opportunity to learn from experience and grow.**

FOR PARENTS

- Set your own example of disciplined conduct and behaviour for your children to follow.
- Plan the DISCIPLINE TECHNIQUES.
- Discuss with your child the importance of discipline.
- Explain the technique and the reason for your using it.



E.g.: If it is a rule that the child must have limited exposure and access to electronic devices and gadgets in the evening then,



- **Set the time**
- **Explain the benefits of minimum visual screen usage.**
- **Be firm that the child doesn't use visual screens more than the time allotted by you.**

- ✚ Be clear about the rules that you want for the family.
- ✚ Schedule or establish rules for him/her to follow.
- ✚ Paste the rules in his/her room or cupboard.



For E.g.: If you wish to make the child follow a time table then:

- **Make a time table with the child's consent.**
- **Explain the benefits of following the time table.**
- **Paste it on the child's cupboard to follow.**



- ✚ Tell them about the after effects of indiscipline.
(What may happen when we perform an indisciplined act.)
- ✚ Give your child small but individual responsibilities.

For E.g.: If your wish is to make a child responsible then:

- Assign your child with small tasks related to home.
- Give small gifts on the successful completion of the tasks.
- Explain that his responsibility and duty is helping everyone at home.
- Also explain that not completing something affects badly.

- ✚ **Lastly:** Reward them.... After all they are your children. But ensure that the rewards act as an effective source of appreciation and motivation for the children instead of pampering them.



FOR STUDENTS

- ✚ What you start (as a point of honour) always finish at home as it'll boost your confidence.
- ✚ Exercise to keep yourself fit and active and your energies focused.
- ✚ Daily exercise will energize your soul, mind, body.



- ✚ Dump excuses and try your level best in very effort.

- ✚ Nothing can be achieved following SHORTCUTS.
- ✚ Create powerful habits, organised routines and humble behaviour.
